

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

1. Pursuant to Section 478.461 R.S.Mo., the practice of transferring one out of every five Circuit Civil and Domestic cases filed in Independence to Kansas City, as ordered by then-presiding judge Charles Atwell effective January 1, 2012, shall remain in effect because the total number of circuit cases pending in the Independence divisions continues to be substantially greater than such cases pending in Kansas City. The cases to be transferred shall be chosen at random, and, consistent with the powers granted in Section 478.461.2(4), any Independence case docketed in a Kansas City division pursuant to this Administrative Order shall not be subject to a change of venue motion as a matter of right. However, upon motion, and for good cause shown, any cases filed in Independence and transferred to a Kansas City division pursuant to this order may be retransferred to an Independence division, upon agreement of the judges between whom the transfer is to take place, so long as a reciprocal case is transferred to the Kansas City division.
2. Cases shall be scheduled for trial by the Circuit Judges in accordance with the 12-week cycle schedules attached to Administrative Order 2013-087. The schedules may be deviated from only in accordance with local rule 6.2.
3. All cases filed pursuant to the Criminal Activity Forfeiture Act (Sections 513.600 through 513.651 and 195.140 R.S.Mo.), referred to herein as CAFA cases, shall be assigned to the docket of the Circuit Court Division assigned to Criminal "A". Such division shall conduct case management conferences and default hearings, and, in the event of a trial, shall have the discretion to assign the case to another Circuit Court Division for trial.
4. Driver cases, as referred to herein, shall include Petitions for Trial de Novo from Administrative Revocations or Suspensions, Application for Hardship Driving Privilege, Applications for Hearing on Refusal to Submit to a Chemical Test, and Petitions for Review. Effective February 3, 2014, the Associate Circuit Judges of Divisions 25, 27, and 29 shall hear such cases filed at Kansas City on a rotating schedule prepared by the Director of Civil Records. The Associate Circuit Judge of Division 32 shall hear such cases filed at Independence.
5. The Associate Circuit Judges of Divisions 25, 26, 27, and 29 shall hear landlord-tenant cases filed at Kansas City on a rotating schedule prepared by the Director of Civil Records. The Associate Circuit Judge of Division 32 shall hear such cases filed at Independence.
6. Effective February 3, 2014, the Associate Circuit Judges of Divisions 26, and 27 shall hear uncontested domestic relations cases filed at Kansas City on a rotating schedule prepared by the Director of Civil Records. The Associate Circuit Judge of Division 30 shall hear such cases filed at Independence.

7. In accordance with Paragraph 1, Section 478.072 R.S.Mo., all Associate Circuit Judge uncontested civil matters in which the petition requests damages exceeding \$5000 shall be on the record and preserved by utilizing electronic, magnetic, mechanical sound, or video recording devices.
8. In accordance with Paragraph 1, Section 478.072 R.S.Mo., all Associate Circuit Judge contested civil matters, regardless of the amount of damages claimed, shall be on the record and preserved by utilizing electronic, magnetic, mechanical sound, or video recording devices.
9. All Judges of the Circuit Court shall rotate evening, weekend, and holiday on-call duty to review domestic violence orders of protection and criminal matters pursuant to a weekly schedule established by administrative order.
10. The Family Court Commissioners shall rotate evening, weekend, and holiday on-call duty to review orders pursuant to Chapter 211 R.S.Mo. pursuant to a weekly schedule established by administrative order.
