## **ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-063**

## **ORDER**

**WHEREAS**, the existence and spread of the COVID-19 virus has resulted in the declaration of a world-wide pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, it is imperative to take steps to protect the health and safety of the public as well as all employees of the 16th Judicial Circuit; and

**WHEREAS**, it is appropriate and necessary to take quick action to reduce the exposure and spread of COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, the unprecedented circumstances existing at this time warrant this administrative action; and

**WHEREAS**, the Presiding Judge of the 16th Judicial Circuit has general administrative authority over the Circuit;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED**, effective Thursday, March 19, 2020:

- 1. For all defendants in the 16th Judicial Circuit who have been sentenced to commitment in the Jackson County Detention Center for a period of seven consecutive days or less; but have not yet reported to the detention center; the surrender date for the defendant to report to the detention center for confinement is stayed for 120 days from the ordered commitment date.
- 2. This administrative order applies to standard incarceration sentences of seven consecutive days or less and orders of "shock time" incarceration of seven consecutive days or less.
- 3. All other dates contained in the order sentencing the defendant to commitment in the detention center are stayed for 120 days
- 4. This Administrative Order is subject to review or modification in 120 days.
