IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Cases shall be scheduled for trial by the Circuit Judges in accordance with the attached 12-week cycle schedules. The schedules may be deviated from only in accordance with local rule 6.2.
- 2. Cases on the Circuit Civil and Family Court Domestic Relations dockets currently assigned to Division 28 shall remain assigned to Division 28 and shall be scheduled for trial at the discretion of the Associate Circuit Judge of Division 28 during those weeks, or portions thereof, that Division 28 is not assigned to hear other dockets.
- 3. The Associate Circuit Judge of Division 28 shall, without further order, accept transfers of civil and/or criminal cases from Divisions 30, 32, and 33 for the purpose of conducting jury trials disposing of such cases and shall schedule such cases for trial during those weeks, or portions thereof, that Division 28 is not assigned to hear other dockets.
- 4. The Associate Circuit Judges of Divisions 25, 26, 27, and 29 shall hear Municipal Trials de Novo filed at Kansas City on a rotating schedule prepared by the Director of Criminal Records, except that the division assigned to Criminal ACJ shall not be included in the rotation during the period so assigned. The Associate Circuit Judge of Division 33 shall hear Municipal Trials de Novo filed at Independence.
- 5. Driver cases, as referred to herein, shall include Petitions for Trial de Novo from Administrative Revocations or Suspensions, Application for Hardship Driving Privilege, Applications for Hearing on Refusal to Submit to a Chemical Test, and Petitions for Review. The Associate Circuit Judges of Divisions 25, 26, 27, and 29 shall hear such cases filed at Kansas City on a rotating schedule prepared by the Director of Civil Records, except that the division assigned to Criminal ACJ shall not be included in the rotation during the period so assigned. The Associate Circuit Judges of Divisions 30 and 32 shall hear such cases filed at Independence.

- 6. In accordance with Paragraph 1, Section 478.072 R.S.Mo., all Associate Circuit Judge uncontested civil matters in which the petition requests damages exceeding \$5000 shall be on the record and preserved by utilizing electronic, magnetic, mechanical sound, or video recording devices.
- 7. In accordance with Paragraph 1, Section 478.072 R.S.Mo., all Associate Circuit Judge contested civil matters, regardless of the amount of damages claimed, shall be on the record and preserved by utilizing electronic, magnetic, mechanical sound, or video recording devices.
- 8. The assigned Criminal ACJ Judges in Kansas City and Independence shall handle after hours on-call duty for criminal matters Monday through Thursday evenings, except as provided for in the administrative order referred to below in paragraph 8.
- 9. All Judges of the Circuit Court shall rotate evening and weekend on-call duty to review domestic violence orders of protection and weekend and holiday duty for criminal matters pursuant to a weekly schedule established by administrative order.
- 10. The Family Court Commissioners shall rotate evening and weekend on-call duty to review orders pursuant to Chapter 211 R.S.Mo. pursuant to a schedule established by administrative order.
